1. The Common Sense Manifesto: A Vision for Global Unity and Justice

Core Principles: Common Sense, Justice, Unity, Reform, and Reconciliation

3.

I. The Pillar of Justice: Judicial and Constitutional Reform.

4.

The current judicial system is identified as a primary source of stress and "exploitation" for the masses. This pillar seeks to restore power to the people.

5.

Abolition of the Current Judiciary: Kim Mubarak proposes legislating the end of the existing court system, which he describes as "biased" and failing to serve the common man.

6.

The Independent Concerned Citizen Court (ICCC): In its place, the ICCC will be established. This is a community-led judicial body designed to ensure that justice is transparent, fair, and free from the influence of "selfish officials."

7.

Abolition of the British Monarchy: A call for Australia to become fully sovereign by removing the Monarchy, ending what is described as an "unconstitutional allegiance" to a foreign power.

8.

Australian Bill of Rights: Enshrining fundamental rights in law to protect all citizens, especially the middle class, minorities, and parents from systemic abuse.

II. THE PILLAR OF EQUALITY: THE GLOBAL HOUSING PROGRAM.

10.

To ensure every human lives with dignity, housing must be treated as a right, not a debt-trap.

11.

Executive Free Houses: A global initiative to provide high-quality, "executive" standard homes to every human being.

12.

Climate-Adaptive Systems: These houses are not "one size fits all." They must be designed with integrated systems (heating, cooling, and structure) tailored to local weather and environmental conditions.

13.

Resource-Based Funding: This program is funded by the "fruits of the land"—specifically natural gas, petroleum, and mineral resources.

14.

The Sovereign Wealth Model: Instead of private profit, resource royalties are placed into a community fund to pay for the construction and permanent maintenance of these homes.

15.

III. THE PILLAR OF INTEGRITY: THE INTERNATIONAL ANTI-CORRUPTION UNIT.

16.

A project of this scale requires a "shield" to protect community wealth from theft and misappropriation.

17.

International Anti-Corruption Unit Without Borders: Founded by Mr. Kidima Mubarak to act as a global watchdog. Its mission is to track public funds and ensure that resource wealth is not siphoned off by corruption.

18.

Transparency and Oversight: Using local community councils in partnership with national leaders to audit and verify that every cent meant

for the "Executive Housing" program is used correctly.

19.

Harsh Justice for Offenders: A belief that "prevention is better than cure." Strict legislative penalties are proposed for those who exploit the community or misappropriate ideas.

20.

IV. THE PILLAR OF DEVELOPMENT: ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL INCLUSION.

21.

Development must be "pro-people" and respect cultural identity.

22.

MR.Kidima Mubarak International Matooke Import and Exports: A business and cultural initiative to bridge the gap between Australia and Africa through organic food trade (green raw bananas), promoting economic self-reliance.

23.

Constitutional Recognition: Being a "lonely stand" to recognize Black Indigenous Peoples in the Constitution and ensuring cultural equity for all.

24.

Cultural and Religious Equity: Pushing for official recognition of cultural milestones, such as making Eid a public holiday, to foster a sense of "unshakable peace" and "lasting tranquillity."

25.

International Special WWII Veterans Unit for Africa: A project focused on the recognition and support of veterans, ensuring those who served are not forgotten.

V. THE PILLAR OF GLOBAL REFORM: A NEW UNITED GLOBAL COMMUNITY POWER.

A radical proposal to change how the world is governed at the highest level.

UN Transformation: Reforming the United Nations into a system of "United Global Community Power." Rather than just a club for national governments, it should be a platform where local communities have a direct voice in global decisions.

27. MR.KIDIMA MUBARAK'S OPERATIONS MANUEL: INTERNATIONAL ANTI- CORRUPTION UNIT WITHOUT BORDERS (IACUWB).

28.

Mission: To protect the "Sovereign Executive Free Housing Fund" and ensure that natural resource wealth is transformed into human dignity without loss or theft.

29.

1. THE DIGITAL LEDGER SYSTEM (FINANCIAL SHIELD).

30.

To prevent "hidden" fees and middle-man interference, to ensure that, the "IACUWB" uses a transparent tracking system.

31.

Real-Time Monitoring: Every royalty payment from mining or gas companies is logged in a public digital ledger. Anyone in the community can see how much money has entered the fund.

32.

Direct Pipeline: Funds move directly from the National Sovereign Fund to the Local Community Council's building projects, bypassing unnecessary departments where money often "disappears."

33.

2. THE "DUAL-KEY" APPROVAL PROCESS (OVERSIGHT).

34.

No single official can move or spend the housing money alone.

35.

National Leader Key: Represents the high-level budget and resource allocation.

36.

Local Council Key: Represents the community's verification that the work is actually being done.

37.

The Rule: Money for the next phase of "executive Free Housing" building is only released once the Local Council confirms that the previous phase met the quality standards.

38.

3. REPORTING AND WHISTLEBLOWING (THE CITIZEN VOICE).

39.

The "**IACUWB**" provides a safe, independent channel for people to report "selfish officials."

40.

Anonymous Portal: Any citizen or construction worker can report bribery, sub-standard materials, or misappropriated ideas directly to the "**IACUWB**".

41.

Independent Investigation: The "**IACUWB**" will be having the power to freeze project funds immediately if an audit shows that "executive" quality is being traded for cheaper, low-quality materials.

42.

4. PREVENTATIVE JUSTICE (THE LEGAL DETERRENT).

43.

MR. Mubarak's philosophy is that "prevention is better than cure."

44.

Harsh Penalties: Legislation ensures that anyone caught stealing from the Housing Fund faces severe consequences, as they are viewed as stealing from the future of every human being.

45.

Public Accountability: All findings of the "**IACUWB**" are made public. There are no "closed-door" settlements for corruption involving the people's resources.

46.

REFINING THE NEXT STEP: This manual ensures that the "Executive Free Houses" stay high-quality and free from corruption. Now that we have the "Shield" (Anti-Corruption) and the "Wallet" (Sovereign Wealth), we should look at the "Hammer and Nails"—the actual building technology.

47. MR. KIDIMA MUBARAK'S EXECUTIVE FREE HOUSES MUST BE ENGINEERED.

48. To make Mr. Kidima Mubarak's vision a reality, the "Executive Free Houses" must be more than just buildings; they must be engineered to work with nature.

49.

Based on the goal of ensuring these homes adapt to local "weather and conditions," here is how the engineering would change between the two extreme environments you chose.

50.

1. THE DESERT EXECUTIVE HOUSE (ARID ENGINEERING).

51.

In a hot, dry desert, the main challenge is intense sun during the day and rapid cooling at night.

52.

Thermal Mass (The Heat Battery): The walls are built using thick, mineral-heavy materials (like adobe, stone, or high-density concrete). These act like a "battery" that absorbs the sun's heat during the day, keeping the inside cool. At night, that stored heat is released to keep the home warm when the desert temperature drops.

53.

Night Purgings: The home features high-level vents. At night, these open automatically to let the hot air escape (heat rises!) while drawing in the cool night air.

54.

Solar Protection: The "Executive" standard includes "white light metal hats" or double-roof systems. This creates an air gap that prevents the sun from ever touching the main structure of the house.

55.

2. THE TROPICAL EXECUTIVE HOUSE (HUMID ENGINEERING).

56.

In the tropics, the challenge isn't just heat—it's high humidity and heavy rain.

57.

Elevated Living (The Stilt System): Houses are raised off the ground. This allows air to circulate underneath the home, preventing dampness and mold from seeping in from the soil.

58.

Breathable Walls: Instead of thick thermal mass, these homes use lightweight materials and jalousie (louvered) windows. These can stay open even during a tropical downpour, allowing constant cross-ventilation to "wick away" moisture from the air.

59.

Active Dehumidification: The energy systems (powered by gas or solar) run specialized desiccant cooling. These systems don't just cool the

air; they pull the "stickiness" (water vapor) out of it to ensure the "executive" comfort levels are maintained.

60.

The Role of the Local Community Council
Because these two houses look and function completely differently, the Local Community Council is the one who chooses which "package" is right for their specific town. They ensure that the Sovereign Wealth Fund pays for the right technology for the right place.


