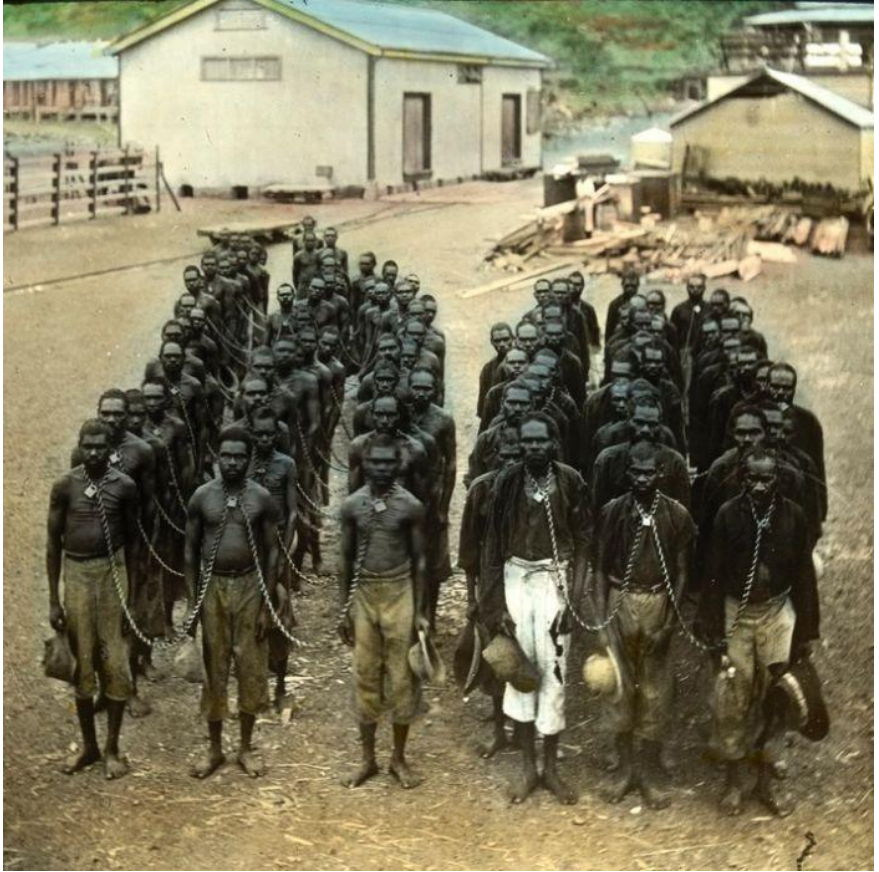

55. A comprehensive Commission of Inquiry is urgently needed to investigate the extent and impact of "Clever Racism." This inquiry must examine recruitment practices, promotion pathways, leadership demographics, and internal cultural dynamics across all levels of government departments, state-owned enterprises, and major

private corporations in Western Australia. It should specifically investigate the disproportionate representation of certain ethnic groups in leadership and decision-making roles, contrasting this with the qualifications and experience of underrepresented communities.

56. The focus must extend beyond mere statistics to deeply probe the subtle mechanisms by which qualified individuals from diverse backgrounds are overlooked, undermined, or denied progression. Such a commission would unearth the root causes of this systemic imbalance, expose the networks that perpetuate it, and lay the groundwork for mandatory reforms designed to foster genuine diversity, equity, and meritocracy. Transparency, accountability, and a commitment to dismantling these entrenched biases are not just moral imperatives but essential for Western Australia to fully harness the talents of all its citizens and to truly live up to its democratic ideals.

**COMMISSION OF INQUIRY INTO THE INSURANCE
COMMISSION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA:
ADDRESSING BIAS, PROFESSIONAL
MISCONDUCT, AND SELFISHNESS.**

57. Public institutions are entrusted with the responsibility of serving the community with integrity, fairness, and impartiality. When these institutions fail to uphold these standards, particularly in areas affecting the financial and personal well-being of citizens, a thorough and independent investigation is paramount. The

Insurance Commission of Western Australia (ICWA), as a vital public entity, must operate beyond reproach. However, persistent concerns regarding bias, professional misconduct, and what appears to be a systemic selfishness—prioritizing institutional self-interest over the genuine needs of claimants—demand immediate scrutiny. A dedicated Commission of Inquiry into ICWA is essential to restore public trust and ensure justice for all claimants. This inquiry must delve into allegations of biased claim assessments, unfair denials, and the protracted handling of cases that cause undue stress and financial hardship to individuals, particularly those already vulnerable due to injury or circumstance.

- 58. It should investigate the training and conduct of assessors, legal representatives, and decision-makers within ICWA, examining the internal policies and incentive structures that may inadvertently or deliberately foster misconduct. Allegations of prioritizing cost-cutting over claimant welfare, of deploying tactics designed to delay or avoid payouts, and of a culture that lacks genuine empathy must be thoroughly explored. The commission should propose robust regulatory frameworks, enhanced oversight mechanisms, and stringent accountability measures to eradicate professional misconduct, eliminate bias, and ensure that ICWA operates with the utmost integrity, serving its true purpose of protecting and compensating the citizens of Western Australia fairly and transparently.**

Abolishing a Bad Culture: Treating Family

Matters and Children in Western Australia like Political Football, Human Shields, and ATM Machines.

- 59.** The sanctity of family and the protection of children are foundational principles of any humane society. Yet, within Western Australia, a disturbing cultural pattern has emerged where family matters, particularly those involving children, are tragically reduced to instruments for adversarial gain. Children, in these contexts, are not treated as vulnerable individuals deserving of protection and unwavering support, but rather as "political footballs" in disputes, "human shields" to gain tactical advantage, or "ATM machines" from which financial resources can be extracted. This is a profound moral failing that inflicts irreparable harm on individuals and erodes societal trust in the very systems designed to protect them. This egregious "bad culture" must be systematically abolished. It requires a multi-faceted approach, beginning with a fundamental shift in the philosophical underpinnings of legal and social services dealing with families. The focus must be irrevocably placed on the best interests of the child, not on the financial or emotional leverage of warring parties.
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- 60.** This demands an overhaul of family law processes, emphasizing mediation, therapeutic jurisprudence, and child-centred dispute resolution models that prioritize cooperation over conflict. Legal aid and counselling services must be strengthened to empower parents to navigate complex systems without resorting to harmful tactics. Furthermore, professionals involved in family law— judges, lawyers, social workers, and child protection

agencies—must undergo mandatory training to identify and actively counteract this manipulative culture, promoting ethical conduct and a steadfast commitment to the welfare of children. Legislation must be reviewed to penalize those who weaponise family matters, ensuring that the devastating practice of treating children as commodities or pawns is not just discouraged, but actively eradicated from Western Australian society.

**URGING FINANCIAL SUPPORT FOR PARENTS: A
GOVERNMENTAL DUTY OF CARE, NOT
CRIMINALISATION.**

61. The role of parents in nurturing the next generation is the cornerstone of societal progress. Yet, in Western Australia, many parents, particularly single parents or those facing socio-economic challenges, are often treated as if they are failing or even "criminals" by systems that ought to be providing robust support. This punitive approach, rather than one of compassionate duty of care, creates cycles of stress, poverty, and disempowerment, ultimately undermining the very children the state purports to protect. Financial insecurity is a leading cause of family breakdown and stress, and when parents struggle to provide basic necessities, it impacts children's health, education, and long-term prospects.
62. It is an undeniable duty of care for the government to financially support parents, recognizing that investing in families is an investment in the future of the nation. This is not about charity, but about fundamental human rights and strategic societal planning. Instead of complex, often degrading,

bureaucratic hurdles, or paternalistic interventions that strip parents of agency, there must be a move towards streamlined, respectful, and adequate financial assistance programs.

63. This includes reviewing and increasing parenting payments, child care subsidies, and housing support, ensuring these are sufficient to meet the genuine cost of raising children in a dignified manner. Furthermore, policies should be implemented to provide easier access to education and training for parents, enabling them to improve their financial stability and participation in the workforce. By treating parents as partners in nation-building, rather than as potential burdens or delinquents, Western Australia can foster a more stable, equitable, and prosperous future for all its citizens, fulfilling its inherent duty to care for its most precious asset: its children.

**(IMPORTANT MATTERS OF PUBLIC INTEREST: A
STATEMENT TO BE EXPLORED IN VOLUME 3)**

- a. My next book, "THE INDEPENDENT VOICE VOLUME 3," will be dedicated to explaining the reason why I do not have a child and why Comrade Shariff will never be part of my family. I reaffirm the legal decision made in the Western Australian court almost twenty years ago and my subsequent public statements regarding this matter. I strongly condemn a group of suspected Criminals who are moving all over the world, using Comrade Shariff as a political football and human shield, playing cheap politics to avoid accountability for their Crimes.

- b. These crimes acts include zooming into my house, infringing upon my private life, stealing my security bulb lights, pouring blood at my house, trespassing, hacking, and stealing my security camera with impunity. As an act of harassment, torture, and threatening my life—planning for my kidnapping, causing anguish, emotional distress, harm, and suffering—this constitutes a breach of quiet enjoyment and a violation of my privacy, rights, and peace.**
- c. This is in direct contravention of Article 12 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and Article 17(1) (2) of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights. Furthermore, they have committed illegal activities of serious "Disruptive Behaviours" pursuant to the Residential Tenancies Act 1987. Despite repeated complaints and reports to the Police and Government Departments, no action has been taken against these repeated offenders, who are criminal suspects in the eyes of the law.**
- d. The same group of criminal suspects has been moving around singing the values of "Inalienable Rights," playing cheap politics by deliberately tarnishing my good reputation without any valid reason whatsoever. They are behaving in a manner considered a clear cover-up and indicative of a guilty conscience.**

Furthermore, they behave in a manner that suggests the "Inalienable Rights" only serves the interests of the children's of apartheid and Nazis. I personally consider this claim as

rubbish, hypocrisy, and double standards, and there are so many examples to prove about my claim.

e.

For example:

Based on the above authority, where are the values of Inalienable Rights in the authority's refusal to protect complaints to protect my fundamental human rights and address my complaints?

f.

Where are the values of Inalienable Rights when the Authority has been hell-bent on taking away people's children by force, torturing them, and sometimes killing them against their will and the consent of their beloved parents?

g.

Where are the values of Inalienable Rights when all governments in Australia have deliberately refused to recognize the First Black Peoples of Australia in the Constitution as the legitimate owners of the land which we all share?

h.

Where are the values of Inalienable Rights whereby all governments in Australia have deliberately refused to arrest and prosecute a dangerous Criminal suspect by the name of David, who resides at 32A Mundford Street, North Beach WA 6020, for continuously zooming into my house, infringing upon my private life, hacking my technological devices, trespassing, burglary, and stealing my security camera at my house in broad daylight with impunity? On Monday, December 8, 2025, at 12:42 PM, the video evidence clearly

identified the criminal suspect. Until this day, yet he walks scot-free without being charged and prosecuted, hell-bent on moving around with his plans of assassinating me on the watch of both Government bodies.

i.

Where are the values of Inalienable Rights whereby the Authority has deliberately refused to arrest and prosecute suspected criminals who have been stealing my security bulb lights at my house?

j.

Where are the values of Inalienable Rights whereby the Authority has deliberately refused to arrest and prosecute criminal suspects at 28 Mundford Street, North Beach WA 6020, who trespassed and poured blood at my house, zooming into my house, hacking my technological devices and security cameras, infringing upon my private life with impunity, and are hell-bent on wanting to see me exiled?

k.

Where are the values of Inalienable Rights whereby the Authority has deliberately refused to arrest and prosecute Officers of the Court and Judicial Officers who have been lying about me in the Court, thus committing perjury and serious misconduct with impunity?

l.

Where are the values of Inalienable Rights whereby the Courts in Australia deliberately refused to issue an official apology to me, when knowing very well that I was offended by the bad character of some Officers of the Court and Judicial Officers' serious misconduct against my good reputation,

violating my fundamental human rights in the Court after causing embarrassment and harm.

m.

Where are the values of Inalienable Rights whereby the Australian Courts, in conjunction with the Police, have been making dictatorship decisions sending Black Indigenous Children to Prisons against their will and the consent of their beloved parents?

Where are the values of Inalienable Rights whereby all Australian Governments have deliberately refused to change the Australian Racist Constitution, which categorizes the Black Peoples as alien, when knowing very well that Australia belongs to the First Black Indigenous Peoples as the legitimate owners of the land which we all share?

o.

Where are the values of Inalienable Rights whereby all Australian Governments have deliberately refused to enact a Bill of Rights in direct contravention of the UN Charter and the Universal Declaration of Human Rights?

p.

Where are the values of Inalienable Rights whereby all Governments and the United Nations have deliberately refused to prosecute Judges, Parliamentarians, and Government Officials for the serious crime of treason because of usurping the Australian Constitution, due to swearing in under the influence of a Foreign Power in direct contravention of Section 44 of the Australian Constitution, UN Charter, Human Rights and the Independence of Australian Sovereignty?

- q. Australia is a Sovereign and Independent State. King Charles is a British Citizen, and Britain is a Foreign Power in accordance with the Australian Constitution and the UN Charter. Based on the above authority, the word "Inalienable Rights" has no moral values in the Australian Government Systems and the Constitution. There is no legislation in the Australian Government based on its principles of Inalienable Rights. Therefore, my humble submission is that the word "Inalienable Rights" should be considered null and void due to hypocrisy and double standards.**
- r. All the points raised above illustrate my point very clearly. Another example is of Mr. Simon Dorante-Day, an Australian man who has been on social media and in newspapers claiming to be the secret, illegitimate son of King Charles III of England and Queen Camilla, and who has made headlines for demanding paternity tests and alleging royal deception. He believes he was conceived in 1965 when Charles (then 17) and Camilla (then 18) met, before Charles went to Australia, with his birth occurring in April 1966 in the UK. Mr. Simon Dorante-Day was adopted at eight months old by the Day family; his adoptive grandparents worked for the Queen, which adds to his belief. He was later left in Australia until this day. The British Monarchy has not publicly acknowledged his claims despite him running all over the place claiming that he belongs to the British Royal Family.**
- s. Please note that the British Royal Family has been in Australia many times. My question is,**

has David, who is smelling on my back running all over the places, and his criminal suspects group ever exiled King Charles to America because he has never recognized Mr. Simon Dorante-Day as his child based on the so-called “Inalienable Rights”? Has there ever been any Government Officials or Courts of Australia refusing King Charles and Queen Camilla entry into Australia because of refusing to acknowledge that Mr. Simon Dorante-Day is not their child? Then, I fail to understand what all the fuss is about Comrade Shariff, who is not a child but a grown-up man, probably 30 years old now.

- t. I made a legitimate decision in the Court of Western Australia, as per my previous Public Statement on Friday, October 24, 2025, affirming that my parental rights and responsibilities were formally and legally relinquished before the Court of Western Australia approximately twenty (20) years ago. This was later followed by a family decision disowning him for good, and that decision will never change.
- u. All will be explained in my next book, “THE INDEPENDENT VOICE BOOK VOLUME 3”. I have made a number of public statements regarding my decision, which will never change, whether I am dead or alive. I have made my position very clear, but these criminal suspects will never listen; they keep harassing me, violating my peace, freedom, and fundamental human rights for no reason. I categorically affirm my position to the Global Community that nobody will ever

change my decision or force me to recognize criminal suspects as part of my family. “Over my dead body”.

v.

It is truly annoying to hear the same criminal suspects working very hard to ensure that I am forced to recognize them as part of my family by force. These are the same people who have been sabotaging and de-campaigning to prevent me from being paid my compensation money, as if we were together by the time I had a car accident. I do not know these people, nor will I ever want to know them, nor talk to them. They have been the same people at 28 Mundford Street, North Beach WA 6020, working very hard that I should be exiled. They claim that I am lying about my family and that I am lying about my injuries. These are the same people who poured blood at my house, zooming into my house 24/7, hacking my technological devices, security cameras, and infringing upon my private life for many years with impunity.

w. Despite the fact that I have never met them, neither talking to them, nor that I am interested in wanting to talk to them. Who on earth would like to be associated with such people of a bad culture of zooming into people's houses? I made my decision pursuant to Article 18 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR), which states that, “Everyone has the right to freedom of thought, conscience and religion; this right includes freedom to change his religion or belief, and freedom either alone or in community with others and in public or

private, to manifest his religion or belief in teaching, practice, worship and observance”.
